BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN FINANCE

The Bachelor of Science in Finance program places emphasis on problem solving, analytics, decision making, and encompasses a broad spectrum of fundamental knowledge and skills necessary for a successful career in the finance and investment industry. The program consists of 120 credits and allows students to focus on unique finance specializations in applicable finance practice sectors and reflects the current state of knowledge and practice within the field. Today's finance professionals are expected to apply accounting and finance skills in the context of business; to transform accounting and financial data into strategic positioning insight; to influence the decisions, actions, and behaviors of others; and to lead the organization at various

levels. This program is designed to prepare finance graduates with the skills and competencies needed to address the fluctuations and opportunities in today's diverse and complex business landscape. Selected courses are offered in a combination of formats including on-campus, online, accelerated, and blended.
